Why is Council building a Community Hub at Burton?

The City of Salisbury has a strong record of integrated community service delivery through Community Hubs with existing sites at Mawson Lakes, Para Hills and most recently at the Salisbury Community Hub.

The value of Community Hubs is that they provide a meeting place for people to learn, play, make social connections and they also provide a facility for a wide range of community activities, programs, services and events. They are generally co-located around other facilities such as shopping centres, recreational facilities or schools. This creates an opportunity for people to undertake a number of activities in one convenient location.

There have been many changes in the western area of the city which mean that the timing for a new community hub is right. For example, the Northern Connector will likely increase the movement of people entering the city from the western entrance (from the western section of Burton to Waterloo Corner) making the Burton precinct a significant future entrance way for population growth and movements into and out of the city. There is also a growing number of young families moving into the area who will benefit from the community hub alongside the existing recreational facilities.

The Burton Community Hub will link nearby facilities such as the Burton Park Football Centre, Burton Park Playground, the Springbank Shopping Plaza and the Kaurna Park Wetlands, as well as providing services for surrounding schools, learning centres and aged care facilities.

What is the Burton Community Hub?

This brand new community facility will be a vibrant and exciting space and replaces the existing Burton Community Centre and Salisbury West Library to provide a range of innovative cultural, learning and recreational opportunities including a brand new library. There will be a variety of relaxing quiet spaces, perfect for individual study, as well as spaces for community programs and meetings. Council has also received funding as part of Phase 2 of the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program for a community shed (The Workshop) and a communal garden area which will complement existing programs and services as well as offer new and exciting opportunities for our community to learn new skills, meet new people and improve their general health and wellbeing.

Where will this community facility be located?

The Burton Community Hub is located at 386 Waterloo Corner Road, Burton, adjacent to the Burton Park Football Centre (home of Salisbury United Football Club) and close to Springbank Plaza Shopping Centre and nearby Kaurna Park Wetlands. The Salisbury West Library will be relocating into the new Burton Community Hub.



How have you involved the community in the design of the new Burton Community Hub?

We undertook community consultation during July – August 2020 through surveys sent out to the local community which provided them with an opportunity to provide input into the design. We received 239 responses from the local community. We also held a workshop at Burton Community Centre on 5 August and the information from that workshop was also incorporated in the design.

When will the new Community Hub be finished?

The Community Hub is due for completion in July 2022 with the grand opening event scheduled for Saturday 23 July 2022 from 11am to 3pm.

Why is the Salisbury West Library moving from its current location at Hollywood Boulevard?

The City of Salisbury recently undertook a study in relation to library services within the western catchment area of the City. The outcome of that study was the recommendation that a library service be created as part of the Burton Community Hub project to service the Burton and Salisbury West catchment area and that library services from the existing Salisbury West Library location be relocated to the Burton Community Hub. The new library will consist of a modern, digitally sophisticated and flexible design with increased space for programs and events, meeting rooms and a learning area. Local patrons will still be able to access library programs and services through accessing our home library service, using the Libraries SA app or utilising Council's free community bus service to take them to any of our other library sites. The last day of operation for the Salisbury West Library will be Saturday 4 June 2022.

Will there be an event celebrating the history of the Salisbury West Library and its patrons?

Absolutely! We are holding a free community event onsite on Saturday 4 June 2022 between 10am and 12pm. There will be some activities and giveaways for children and a special Storytime. Light refreshments will also be provided.

How do I access library services after the Salisbury West Library closure?

Following the closure of Salisbury West Library, there are still many ways you can access all of your favourite library services and programs. Our Home Library Service is available for those who have limited mobility and Council's free community bus stops at Hollywood Plaza and can take you to a number of local venues including the Salisbury Community Hub where you can enjoy a coffee whilst you browse the vast library collections or even participate in any of the onsite programs. For those who are digitally savvy, you can also access a range of library services online via the Libraries SA app including free digital magazines, books and reference material.

What is the history of the Salisbury West Library?

Salisbury West opened on 5 July 1993 at its current location on Hollywood Boulevard. The library shares the building with Salisbury Primary Health Care Services.



Will I be able to access the same library services at the Burton Community Hub?

Most definitely! The Burton Community Hub site is larger than the existing library site at Salisbury West and this will provide opportunities to expand the current services offered.

What is the project cost and will it impact my rates?

The estimated projected cost is \$6.5 million and this has been incorporated into our long term financial plan.

What kind of programs and services will be available?

This exciting new facility is designed to service the growing needs of the whole community including local residents, schools and businesses. It will provide a variety of accessible spaces, some of which will be available for hire by groups and organisations and will see an increased offering of innovative programs.

The centre will also provide services for:

- Residents to connect with others and develop new friendships
- · School students and young people to meet, learn, and participate in group and individual activities
- New and experienced gardeners to help our community garden grow
- Storytellers to record their stories on video and/or audio
- Seniors to access information and be socially connected
- Businesses looking for networking opportunities and additional space to do business
- Families to enjoy activity programs and access the internet
- Anyone who would like to access information regarding local services, walking trails and events in the local area
- · Volunteers wanting to become involved in the local community

The large hall area will be complete with projector screen and a kitchen, providing a great space for local businesses, not for profit organisations and sporting clubs to host events such as Annual General Meetings, presentation nights, business breakfasts and conferences. Smaller rooms will also be available for meetings and workshops. There may be a charge applied for the use of these spaces.

What is The Workshop?

The Workshop is a shed facility which will host a variety of community centred programs. As part of its inclusive design, programs for those with a disability will also be incorporated into the scheduled programming.



How can I be involved with the communal garden?

The communal garden will be a dedicated food producing area for all of our community to enjoy through participation in a range of programs for all ages that support health and wellbeing and/or as a volunteer. This will include programs for all ages that introduce our community to the health and nutrition benefits of growing your own produce and a range of workshops on interesting gardening topics. Please note that in order for the whole community to enjoy the wide variety of programs and events on offer, no private hire of garden beds for the purposes of personal food production will be available.

When did the Burton Community Centre close to the public?

The centre closed on 30 June 2021.

What will happen to the Salisbury West Library site following the relocation?

We have a number of early concepts in mind which are yet to be determined. We will keep our community informed of further developments as they occur.

Will there be an opening day event for the community?

Yes! The grand opening event is to be held on Saturday 23 July 2022 from 11am to 3pm and plans are already underway to provide a fun packed day full of free activities for the entire community. The entire centre will be open for people to walk through and experience all the great things on offer as part of this new facility.
