

Declaration under Section 19 Local Nuisance and Litter Control Act 2016

Salisbury (or delegate) can exempt a person from the application of Section 18- Causing a local nuisance, in respect of a specified activity if the Council for the area (or delegate) in which the activity is to be carried on declares, by notice in writing, in accordance with this the Act section, that the person is so exempt.

This declaration has been considered and issued to the **Applicant** for the purposes of the following specified activity:

- concerts or events;
- activities using amplified sound.

This declaration can be unconditional or subject to conditions, including (but not limited to) conditions relating to—

- (a) the permitted times or periods of time for carrying on the activity; or
(b) the manner of carrying on the activity.

We will employ up to nine security guards to

- monitor behaviour within the carpark, preventing any antisocial conduct and ensuring that vehicles depart in an orderly and a quiet manner.
- Man, and monitor each entry point to the hall to ensure order safety and a smooth run of the evening.
- Specifically brought forward the start time of the event to 3pm to conclude at 11pm

Child minders will be manning the jumping castle to always ensure children's safety.

NASA will hand deliver notices to all surrounding residence advising of the upcoming event to all houses on the potentially affected plan.

For any Emergency that takes place on the night the logistics team will execute the emergency policy to ensure guests safety.

Conditions

In addition to controls specified above in proposed strategy for minimising, managing and monitoring the effects of the local nuisance on potentially affected persons; you are required to:

- Have independent security and or authorised persons monitor noise levels in car park areas to ensure amplified music and voices are not excessive
- If music is deemed to be excessive at the boundary of the property then please address by adjusting volumes
- Respond to any resident complaints in a timely manner and notify council via email as soon as practical

Jumping castle for children

- All use and activity on jumping castle to cease by 7.30pm
- As this is located outside and likely to generate ongoing noise from children the jumping castle is to be restricted and use is to cease by 7.30pm allowing for a reduction in outside noise nuisances from people and voices.
- The doors of the venue located on the northern side of the property shall be kept closed to reduce noise from within the main venue escaping and impacting on local residents and in particular restricted access and movements from 7.30pm.

Traffic Management

- Due to large number of attendees, it is recommended that you seek independent traffic management advice to manage safe movements into the venue, within the venue and departure from the venue.
