# The proposed strategy for minimising, managing and monitoring the effects of the local nuisance on potentially affected persons;

- -Provide residents with a detailed schedule of upcoming early morning pours, including expected dates and durations, so they can anticipate and prepare for any temporary disruptions. Notice Board on Front Fence as discussed.
- -Ensure that any required lighting is directed away from nearby residences to reduce light pollution.
- -Limit loud machinery use and restrict activities to only essential tasks during early morning hours.
- -Organise and stage equipment and materials the day before to minimize setup time in the morning, reducing the need for additional noise during early hours.
- -Conduct a pre-pour briefing with all site personnel to reinforce quiet work practices, including handling equipment and materials with care to avoid unnecessary noise.
- -Avoid using loudspeakers or radios on site and communicate instructions to workers directly to keep noise levels low.
- -Schedule concrete truck arrivals in staggered intervals to reduce traffic noise and prevent vehicles from idling near residential areas.
- -Notify potentially affected residents well in advance, explaining the timing, duration, and purpose of early morning pours.
