COVID-19 VACCINE YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED



Why do I need to get vaccinated?

Anyone at any age can get COVID-19. If you're unvaccinated, you have the highest risk of becoming seriously ill from the virus. By getting vaccinated, you will also be able to travel, go to events and see loved ones in the future.

Why do I need to get a booster vaccination?

Two doses of the vaccine provide very good protection, especially against severe illness. A booster dose makes sure the protection from your first two doses is stronger and lasts longer. It's the best way to keep you, your loved ones and our community safe.

Is the vaccine safe?

The vaccine is safe and can save lives. The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) won't approve a vaccine for use in Australia unless it's safe and effective.

Is the vaccine safe if I'm pregnant or breastfeeding?

The Moderna and Pfizer vaccines are safe for women who are pregnant, planning pregnancy, or breastfeeding. Tens of thousands of healthy babies have now been born to vaccinated women.

Does the vaccine cause infertility?

No. The COVID-19 vaccine does not cause infertility or sterilisation.

Who can get the vaccine?

Vaccines are free and available to anyone 5 years of age and older.

Is the vaccine safe for my child?

The vaccine is the best way to keep your child from getting very sick with COVID-19.

Can I still get COVID-19 if I'm vaccinated?

If you're vaccinated, you can still get COVID-19. But you're less likely to become seriously ill and have to go to the hospital.
