

GROW FOR GOLD IN 2018

Salisbury residents aged 3 to 16 are encouraged to sign up for the popular annual Growing for Gold program and enjoy an array of free sports sessions.

The program, which runs in the September/October school holidays, gives children a chance to participate in sport and recreational activities within the local community – entirely for free.

The program emphasises:

- Inclusiveness all children are welcome to participate, regardless of cultural background, disability, or socio-economic background.
- Opportunity sessions are free for all participants.
