



Application for a declaration under Section 19 Local Nuisance and Litter Control Act 2016

The City of Salisbury can exempt a person from the application of Section 18 Causing local nuisance under the Local Nuisance and Litter Control Act 2016. To consider such an application Council requires and application that includes a Nuisance Management Plan for activities for which an exemption may be declared under Section 19 of the Local Nuisance and Litter Control Act 2016, namely:

- (a) construction or demolition works;
- (b) concerts or events;
- (c) activities using amplified sound.

The proposed process for recording details about complaints, including –

- contact details for each complainant; and
- the date and time of the complaint; and

Measurement procedures for determining presence of local nuisance

For the purposes of section 21(d) of the Local Nuisance and Litter Control Act 2016, if, in determining the presence of local nuisance, section 17(1) of the Act (including a provision referred to by that section) requires an authorised officer to form an opinion about a matter, the officer may form the opinion based on the officer's own senses.
