ARTIST BRIEF – BAGSTER ROAD COMMUNITY CENTRE, SALISBURY NORTH

CITY OF SALISBURY – CREATE-A-PLACE PROJECT

The City of Salisbury would like to invite suitably qualified artists to submit their expression of interest for the design, fabrication and installation of an aboriginal themed artwork at the Bagster Road Community Centre. This work will become a part of the City of Salisbury's art trail and assist in beautifying our region.

The City of Salisbury is located in the northern Adelaide region only 25 km from the Adelaide Central Business District. The City of Salisbury has a population of 142,560 spanning over 31 suburbs, across 158 Km. Salisbury is a City that provides opportunity for our residents, businesses and visitors through investment in its future, by valuing the natural environments, providing a great lifestyle, encouraging and supporting a vibrant and innovative culture through art and community wellbeing.

Project Sites

Bagster Road Community Centre

Bagster Road Community Centre exists to provide a safe, non-threatening environment for individuals of all ages, ethnicity, religion, gender and creed. This environment is established to enable the community and individuals within the wider community to identify and achieve their short term, long term and life goals. We recognise to achieve this we will need to:

- Address social and structural inequality through the interruption of the cycle effect of poverty and disadvantage.
- Enhance community and family cohesiveness
- Facilitate the enhancement and development of skills
- Foster independence through mutual self-help and support.

Concept of Works

We are encouraging artists to be artistic and creative in a way that will entice the local community to want to visit the Centre. As this is a community centre, we are asking artists to take into consideration the demographic and cultural users of the building and ask that their concepts include aboriginal themed artworks.

We want so see original designs capturing colour and vibrancy to make, not only the users of the centre, but people walking past stop and think wow, that's amazing.





The walls measure approx. 19sqm and the retaining wall measures approx. 16sqm.

Practical Considerations

The artist must exercise a duty of care in the concept design and consider the management of risk and public safety. The artworks should be produced from durable materials, require minimal maintenance and will be appropriate in scale.

The wall is on a community centre building so we encourage artists to appeal to people of all ages, cultural backgrounds and links with the artwork.

Artists will also need to ensure all elements:

- Is safe for the general public;
- Is durable, robust, resilient and painted with appropriate high-quality materials;
- Be easily cleaned to remove dirt and general grime;
- Be resistant to graffiti or treated with anti-graffiti coating; and
- Meet all relevant safety standards, City of Salisbury Work Health and Safety clauses as per the Terms and Conditions.

The public artwork is limited by the nature of the location hence is open to the possibility of vandalism and desecration.

Copyright

The copyright for the design will remain at all times with the artist. The completed artwork and will become an asset within the City of Salisbury and will be added to the Councils Register.

Budget

An amount of \$500 will be paid to the selected artist upon approval of the concept. This will be included in the total commission of \$5,000 (ex GST).

Acknowledgement by the City of Salisbury

The City of Salisbury will acknowledge the artist and artwork in a manner fitting to site. The artist of the work will be acknowledged in any publicity or promotion materials regarding the project.
