1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 At its February 2016 meeting Council endorsed a youth-adult partnership model of community evaluation, as the methodology to be used for the development of the new Youth Action Plan (YAP).
- 1.2 The YAP is being developed via the Youth Council project team (which consists of Youth Council members), and a council project team (which consists of internal council staff). The internal council staff team consists of Nick Griguol who represents Youth Council on the council to assist with developing and strengthening youth-adult partnerships.
- 1.3 The YAP methodology includes a range of external consultations and responsibility for leading the various consultations is shared between Youth Council and council staff.
- 1.4 This report will provide an update of the works that have undertaken and planned activity by the project team.

2. CONSULTATION / COMMUNICATIONInternal

- 2.1 The YAP is a whole-of-council plan which supports the achievement of several key directions of the City Plan. The council project team has been established to reflect and represent the range of stakeholders in this project, including the Youth Council.

- 2.2 Since the previous status update report in August, one project team meeting and two project board meetings have been held.
- 2.3 The Community Planner, Youth has also met with:
- Manager Business Systems and Solutions regarding placement opportunities for disengaged youth
 - Community Planning Project Officer and external stakeholders relevant to Aboriginal youth development to plan culturally competent consultations
 - Manager Twelve25 Salisbury Youth Enterprise Centre and Workskil Inc. place manager to plan a consultation workshop in partnership with Workskil Transition Centre
 - The City of Salisbury Executive Group, to present a project update and seek feedback.

External

- 2.4 External youth consultations conducted in partnership with Youth Council since the August Youth Council Sub Committee meeting included:
- Para Hills High School;
 - Salisbury High School;
 - Temple Christian College years 9-12 SRCs;
 - Paralowie R-12 year 12 Student Voice cohort; and
 - Endeavour College

3. REPORT

- 3.1 Youth Council members continue to enthusiastically undertake community consultations with youth in Salisbury.
- 3.2 The second Youth Council Project Team theme of 'Development' is underway.
- 3.3 The working groups are conducting youth consultations in the areas of Health/Wellbeing and Education/Employment.
- 3.4 Internal project team consultations have generated the following key ideas:
- Targeting consultations in sport and recreation centres
 - Ways to engage with Aboriginal youth
 - Guest speaker options for a youth forum for young people living with disability
- 3.5 Twelve25 have conducted numerous consultations with groups attending the centre.
- 3.6 The council project team will have its next meeting on 17 October. Nick Griguol will continue to represent Youth Council on the council project team.
- 3.7 The Community Planner Youth and Nick Griguol presented a project update to the Executive Group on September 20.

- 3.8 The Community Planner Youth will attend a workshop with Elected Members at the Informal Strategy meeting scheduled for October 4.
- 3.9 Upcoming consultations are booked for Salisbury East and Temple Christian School.
- 3.10 Pizza and Pathways will be held on September 23 at Twelve25. The purpose is to consult with young people not engaged in education, employment and training (NEET).
- 3.11 A forum for young people living with a disability will be held on October 14 in the John Harvey Gallery in partnership with key external stakeholders, NDIS northern office, and Purple Orange, Julia Farr's youth participation team.
- 3.12 At the time of writing this report, 863 young people have now been directly consulted.
- 3.13 The YAP is due to be completed by April 2017.

4. CONCLUSION / PROPOSAL

- 4.1 The development of the new YAP is currently on track to be completed on time, and within budget.
- 4.2 The target consultation number is 1500 and the work to date is well ahead of this target.
- 4.3 A further update will be provided at the next Youth Council Sub Committee meeting in October 2016.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 At its February meeting, Council endorsed a youth-adult partnership model of community evaluation as the methodology to be used for the development of the new Youth action Plan (YAP).
- 1.2 A number of working parties were formed under the banner of Diversity, Development, Active and Creative Lifestyles to facilitate information and engagement on the following areas of youth concern;
 - Diversity - Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual, Trans, Intersex, and Questioning (LGBTIQ) and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD);
 - Development - Health and Education and Employment; and
 - Active and Creative Lifestyles.
- 1.3 Working Party membership is as follows:
 - Health- Rebecca Etienne (team leader), Bianca Bilsborow, Julie Ping, Joel Winder, Cameron Rowe and Mark Verdini;
 - Employment and Education- Taylor Sawtell (team leader), Nick Griguol, Cresilda Daitol, Michael Santos, Mimona Abdulla, Roshan Chamlagai and Eric Ngirimana;
 - Active Lifestyles (formerly Sports) - Michael Santos, Cresilda Daitol, Mimona Abdalla, Nick Griguol, Taylor Sawtell, Cameron Rowe and Eric Ngirimana; and

- Creative Lifestyles (formerly Arts) - Bianca Bilsborow, Rebecca Etienne, Joel Winder, Julie Ping, and Mark Verdini.

3.1 This report contains a summary update from the following working parties Health, Employment and Education. The Current working parties will end in mid-October and the final two working parties for the year will commence. They will be Active and Creative.

3.2 The Health Working Party has:

- met with Headspace YAC and formed a partnership to run a mental health expo at Twelve25 during mental health week in October. This involves developing a flyer, advertising the event and assisting with activities on the day;
- assisted with school consultations and consulted with their peers on an individual basis.

3.3 The Employment and Education Working party has:

- worked in partnership with Twelve25 and Workskil Salisbury to run an employment forum for young people aged 17-25 years who are transitioning into employment from Newstart benefits or studying;
- assisted with consultations with the Salisbury Multicultural homework clubs and Flexible learning students at Twelve25 and Paralowie House.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 National Youth week is celebrated across Australia as a unique opportunity for the community to recognize and celebrate the contribution of young people. It provides an opportunity for local youth to influence, plan and develop a significant community event. This contributes to our young people's wellbeing in our community.
- 1.2 National Youth Week 2016 was celebrated from 8 April to 17 April.
- 1.3 In 2016 Twelve25 and Youth Council hosted a major event being the Northern Youth Arts Market at the John Harvey Gallery in collaboration with the City of Tea Tree Gully.
- 1.4 Other activities included: An art exhibition in the John Harvey Gallery and The Mawson Centre, Movie Night, Comic Labs with Georgina Chadderton at the Len Beadell Library, Youth Arts Enterprise Bootcamp in Tea Tree Gully.
- 1.5 These activities were funded through the support of Office for Youth, City of Salisbury and City of Tea Tree Gully.

3. REPORT

- 3.1 National Youth Week 2017 will run from 31 March to 9 April.
 - 3.1.1 The theme for National Youth Week 2017 is youTHRIVE focusing on the importance of young South Australian's physical, mental, emotional and social wellbeing.
 - 3.1.2 A SWOT (Strength, Weakness, Opportunities and Threats) analysis of the Northern Youth Arts Markets was hosted identifying that stall holders were pleased with the event, majority of the stallholders sold products, there were 21 stall holders and a variety of other activities that added to the event and an opportunity for next Youth Week to switch roles and host the market in Tea Tree Gully and the enterprise bootcamp in Salisbury.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The staff from Twelve25 participate in the Youth Council Sub Committee Meetings to ensure a strong working relationship with the Youth Council.

3. REPORT

- 3.1 The report provides Youth Council members with information on Twelve25's programs and services. The update on Twelve25 programs are:
 - 3.1.1 A Wheels in Motion Forum was held on Saturday 3rd September in the John Harvey Gallery. 70 young people from Playford and Salisbury attended.
 - 3.1.2 The Beyond Racism program concluded for 10 participants on Thursday 8th September with a celebration dinner, jumpers provided to each participant, their recorded stories and guest speaker Basil Colman covering Aboriginal Culture & Emotional Healing. Feedback from all participants has been positive.

- 3.1.3 The latest project of the Jibba Jabba TV program was a gambling advert about poker machines which has received over 250,000 video views on Facebook. A new video project about healthy relationships and challenging stereotypes is currently underway.
- 3.1.4 Staff and Volunteers participated in train the trainer coffee making at Aroma Fresh. A training package for the Coffee Social enterprise project is currently being finalised. There are seventeen young people on the Coffee Connoisseur expression of interest list.
- 3.1.5 The Pizza Trailer for the Pizza Social Enterprise has been inspected and approved for delivery, so the next step of the project is signage and food safety and participant training.
- 3.1.6 Twelve25 is hosting two school holiday activities in the October holidays - Master Cooks and Songwriters Workshop with Kylie Brice.
- 3.1.7 The City of Salisbury and City of Playford are hosting a screening of the documentary Embrace on Friday 14th October. Entry is a gold coin donation going to the Butterfly Foundation.
- 3.1.8 Twelve25, Salisbury Youth Council and Headspace are celebrating the FEAST Festival in collaboration with an art competition and documentary screening of 'Gayby Baby' which documents the views of young people living in a same sex parented household. This will be held on Friday 28th October.
- 3.1.9 The Parafield Gardens High School and Twelve25 Duke of Edinburgh program will conclude the two term program with their 4 day Adventurous Journey at Seeonee Hills in the October School Holidays.
- 3.1.10 Other activities which are being planned include;
- Swim Club at the Salisbury Recreation Precinct (Summer).
 - Getting Your Learners two day workshop and test in November.
 - Salisbury Youth Performing Arts Group performed their written script to family and friends in September. Their next project will be working towards performing to school groups in the Fringe - Salisbury Secret Garden 2017.
 - Twelve25 and Youth Council hosting a stall at the Salisbury High School Annual Wellbeing Day in October.

4. CONCLUSION / PROPOSAL

- 4.1 The Youth Council members to be aware of programs and services on offer at Twelve25 for their own information and to share their knowledge with the wider community of young people.
