Anti-Bullying Project Team update October 9 2018

The team hosted an Anti-Bullying forum in partnership with the SRC at Salisbury East High School on August 9th 2018

Anti-Bullying Forum

In attendance were 100 students made up of SRC representatives and students from years 8-12

Guest presenters were SAPOL who spoke about Cyber safety and Bullying and Headspace who spoke about their new Anti-Bullying video project and conducted an engagement activity

Youth Council facilitated groups of young people to discuss issues of bullying, ways to respond, the effect of bullying on young people.

The information gathered was handed over to the SRC reps and Youth Council will meet with them in October to discuss Anti-Bullying strategies the school has implemented from the information gathered at the forum

In Addition to this forum the team is in discussion with Salisbury East to host a students and parents evening forum in late August and the development of a landing page on the City of Salisbury Website with Anti-bullying content developed by Youth Council members

The team is currently collect information, videos, fact sheets and working with Headspace to gather the content for the page.

The team are also researching wristbands to have produced to include the link to their page

Disability Inclusion Project Team Update October 2018

The team hosted a Disability Inclusion Forum in partnership with Julia Farr Youth on August 15th in the John Harvey Gallery.

The forum had approx. 25 young people in attendance, Local Disability Service providers, guest speakers and Dr Pip Williams who is the consultant for Council's Ability Inclusion Strategy.

A panel of young people who live with disabilities shared their stories and answered questions. The panel was made up of two Youth Council Members and Two members of Julia Farr Youth.

Local services shared about their services and provided information to young people.

Positive ideas and feedback were provided by participants and this information has been shared with Dr Williams and Mike Taggart and his team.

In addition to this event the Disability Inclusion Team was to assist with the planning and running of a school holiday sports disability program at Parafield Gardens Recreation Centre in September, however due to late notice and little communication from the centre this did not occur.

The Disability Inclusion team is now in discussion with the Manager of the recreation centre to look at future opportunities

I would like to also share a personal comment

A direct and very positive outcome of the forum was that I gained employment through Job Prospects for at least 15 hours a week sharing my story, consulting with young people with disabilities and promoting the services of Job prospects.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The staff from Twelve25 participates in the Youth Council Sub Committee meetings to ensure a strong working relationship with Youth Council.
- 1.2 In the February council decision (Resolution 2293/2018) there was a decision which included (in Section 3b) a report requirement to include 'analysis and reporting of performance, regular activities, programs and events of Youth Programming across the Community Capacity and Learning Division'.
- 1.3 The report provides Members with updates and information from the Community Capacity and Learning Division.

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3. REPORT

COMMUNITY CENTRE AND LIBRARY BASED YOUTH PROGRAMS

- 3.1 All Community Centres, the Para Hills Community Hub and the Len Beadell Library offer a range of programs that develop employment skills including job search programs and digital literacy. These programs are available to all those aged 17 and over and no longer in school. We are also developing a STEM industry based youth forum for year 9's to be held in term 2 or 3 of 2019. This project would be working with a variety of industry representatives, NASSSA and local schools.
- 3.2 The Community Learning Programs team have established the following programs/events:
 - 3.2.1 The Lab This weekly technology based program is designed specifically for children with high functioning Autism or Asperger's Syndrome and is provided in partnership with Inclusive Directions. This program attracts mostly upper primary and early secondary (years 7 and 8).
 - 3.2.2 I addition to the above programs, the new Para Hills Community Hub currently offers financial counselling and the SCOAP No Interest Loan Scheme which provides people on low incomes safe, fair and affordable loans for fridges, washing machines and furniture as well as education and medical expenses.
 - 3.2.3 The Mawson Centre offers coding and Robotics classes for upper primary/early Secondary students. These classes build students STEM skills relating to technology and engineering and also increase students ability to work as a team.
 - 3.2.4 'A' Gamers for young people between 12 and 17 years that have Autism is offered at the Salisbury East Neighbourhood Centre. This program encourages social interactions via PC and console games.

TWELVE25 PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

- 3.3 Getting your L's program ran on 20, 21 and 24 August 2018. The program supports young people to obtain their Learner's permit, with 2 days (Monday and Tuesday) of mentoring at Twelve25 provided by facilitators from Bagster Road Community Centre, followed by support to sit the Learners test at Bagster Road Community Centre (Friday). Thirteen young people attended this program had a 100% attainment for attendees. The next Getting your L's program is scheduled for October 2018.
- 3.4 Twelve25 partnered with Thomas More College and Rotary Club of Salisbury on 27 August 2018 to run the "Rotary Youth Driver Awareness" program for 150 year 10 students. This program is funded by the school and Rotary.
- 3.5 Twelve25's social enterprise models continue to develop.
- 3.6 Coffee Connoisseurs has continued to operate every Saturday from 7.30 am until 12 noon (depending on weather and crowd) at Carisbrooke Reserve servicing the 'Park Run' activity and the public.

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- 3.7 Salisbury City Rotaract Inc. continues to meet at Twelve25 fortnightly. It is a youth 18-25 years leadership and community service organisation established in partnership with Rotary Club of Salisbury Inc.
- 3.8 Jibba Jabba Radio has started Round 18 (Terms 3 and 4, 2018) with 9 participants.
- 3.9 Salisbury Performing Arts group has continued to grow with 14 young people 12 18 years attending on Thursday nights. Due to popular demand, Twelve25 are piloting a new group for 18-30 year olds which runs immediately after the younger group. This older group is cost neutral to council. Theatre group held a performance on 23 August 2018.
- 3.10 Twelve25 is again partnering with Northern Adelaide State Secondary Schools Alliance (NASSSA) to support the regional schools debating competition. The program has now commenced. Debating is a skill set which builds public speaking, lateral thinking and confidence. Seven Northern Schools are participating with teams of 3-5 students. All minor round debates this year are at Twelve25.
- 3.11 Twelve25 continues to partner with Bowden Brompton School's Integrate Program. This program is designed to work intensively with 5-6 exceedingly disengaged teenage boys and girls from Salisbury. The group has breakfast at the centre (with supervision from their teacher and youth worker) before heading to their planned activity for the day. For some of these activities the school hires community centre space or resources. The boys have settled into the centre norms and behaviors well and increases in attendance and engagement have been noted by the School.
- 3.12 Esports Twelve25 is hosting a come and try day on 9 October 2018 as part of the school holiday programs.

4. CONCLUSION / PROPOSAL

4.1 The programs and services on offer across the Community Capacity and Learning division is provided to Members for information and to share with the wider community of young people.
