1. Background

The project was developed after brainstorming ideas about the key issues for young people..

The focus for this project was developed after brainstorming ideas about the current key issues for young people. From these discussions it was clear that the youth members were passionate about the Mental Health of young people, particularly young men.

2. Description of Project

Youth Council will work in partnership with local sporting clubs and schools to deliver sessions to young people aged 12-17 years and young men aged 18-30 years to discuss mental health issues. This will include guest speakers and activities to assist young men to be able to learn about strategies and to link to services.

From these discussions Youth Council expressed a desire to work with organisations who assist young people who identify as LGBTIQA+. Partnering with these organisations to provide safe events, information sharing and workshops was identified as a high priority for 2021

2. Description of Project

The LGBTIQA+ Team will work in partnership with Rainbow Volunteers (Northern Volunteering) and Gender Dive (Headspace) to assist young people to connect with social groups and services for LGBTIQA+ young people in the North

The team will deliver a small event at Twelve25 during Feast Week, an event where young people can engage in activities in a safe space and learn about services. They will also create information packs to hand out to young people at this event

The team also plan to host a pop up stall at the Salisbury Hub on Wear it Purple Day and do activities such as Mug decorating, badge making and pot plant decorating

They will also develop content for Facebook to be posted during Feast Week, Wear it Purple Day and other significant dates on the LGBTIQA+ calendar

Thrive Wellbeing	MARCH 25 TH APRIL 27 TH – JULY 1 ST	As part of the Youth-led Grant Twelve25 have recruited 9 young people from the local council area to meet for a Youth Consultation on March 25 th to discuss what is important to them in the area of wellbeing, and to help plan the Thrive community round. The school rounds will commence in Term 2, 2021. Participating schools include; Northern Adelaide Senior College, Para Hills High School, Gawler & District College, Endeavour College and Parafield Gardens High School.
Getting your L's	APRIL 13 TH	18 participants are currently booked in, with an orientation session scheduled on March 29 th to assist participants with paperwork and preparation prior to their workshop on April 13 th . 7 volunteers are confirmed to support participants for both the orientation and workshop day.
E-sports	APRIL 22 ND	The League of Legends E-sports tournament was originally planned for March 20 th , but has been postponed due to low registration numbers. This program will be rescheduled for a later date in coming weeks. A Come and Play Video Games day is planned for the April school holidays for 7 – 14 year olds at the Salisbury Hub.
