# 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Burton Community Hub (BCH) is an exciting new facility, which consists of the Workshop, a communal garden, community programs and hire spaces, and the relocated Salisbury West Library.
- 1.2 The hours of operation are Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm and 10am to 2pm on Saturdays.
- 1.3 BCH is scheduled to open its doors to the public on Monday 25 July 2022 with the official opening event scheduled for Sunday 31 July 2022.
- 1.4 The Administration notes that these timeframes have been extended since the last report on 10 May 2022. This is due to further supply chain issues and delays in the delivery of some equipment.
- 1.5 To enable it to be a thriving and highly activated community facility, a six-month uplift program (Attachment 1) will begin from 1 August 2022.
- 1.6 This report seeks to provide Sub Committee members with an update on the site, planned service offering, opening day event and future directions of the BCH.

# 4. **REPORT**

- 4.1 <u>Site Update</u>
  - 4.1.1 Site furniture and equipment are arriving in the weeks beginning 4 and 11 July 2022. During this time a wide range of staff will be onsite undertaking a variety of tasks such as furniture placement, book shelving and testing of all computer systems in preparation for the site opening on Monday 25 July.
  - 4.1.2 As previously noted, there have been supply chain issues and delays in the delivery of some equipment. However, the Project Manager (Infrastructure) in collaboration with the Business Systems and Solutions Team continues to work towards a solution regarding internet connectivity. These teams are working to ensure that there is no major disruption to the operations from a community perspective.

# 4.2 Programs and Events

- 4.2.1 The six-month uplift program has now been coordinated and will begin being delivered on site from 1 August 2022. A copy of the uplift program is included as Attachment 1.
- 4.2.2 Information on the new programs will be included in the upcoming Term Guide for Term 3, which will be available prior to opening. A digital version will be also available at www.salisbury.sa.gov.au/community/libraries/term-guide
- 4.2.3 The major opening event is scheduled for Sunday 31 July 2022 between 11am and 3pm and will involve a variety of free and fun activities for all ages.

- 4.2.4 The day will commence with a range of formal proceedings emceed by Deputy Mayor Chad Buchanan. It will include a Welcome to Country by Senior Kaurna Elder Frank Wanganeen, a smoking ceremony by Uncle Moogy and a variety of speakers including Mayor Gillian Aldridge, Cr Donna Proleta and artist Elizabeth Close
- 4.2.5 The mural by Elizabeth Close is now complete, including an anti-graffiti layer, and will be the backdrop for the formal proceedings at the opening event.
- 4.2.6 Invitations to the opening event have been distributed both digitally and by post, including to several local aged care facilities, Springbank Plaza shops, local schools and residential homes in McInnes Street.
- 4.2.7 A traffic management plan has been prepared by SEM Group and will be managed by two staff on the day. Once approved by all stakeholders, this plan will be filed with Department Infrastructure and Transport and provided to relevant stakeholders for their information.
- 4.2.8 Due to the popularity of the Para Hills Community Hub Seed Library project, the Burton Community Hub will be launching its own Seed Library at the opening day.
- 4.2.9 The funded programs for The Workshop (Monday to Thursday) and the communal garden (Tuesday to Thursday) will commence in August 2022.
- 4.2.10 The NDIS funded "Fun on Fridays" and STARS group, who previously met at Burton Community Centre will also hold programs onsite in the hall twice per week from August 2022.
- 4.2.11 Recruitment for volunteers for the site is also proceeding with one appointment to provide program support already made been. It is anticipated that further inquiries and appointments will follow once the building is open and functional, and as such a recurring advertisement is included in the City of Salisbury's Volunteer Connect.
- 4.3 <u>Room Hire</u>
  - 4.3.1 The fees and charges relating to room hire were approved at the June Council meeting and will be advertised on the website. Further advertising regarding room hire will now be undertaken to attract a wide range of community members and organisations into the wide range of available spaces.
  - 4.3.2 Council has adopted the SpacetoCo automated room booking system across a range of sites, including BCH. This software will allow for a more streamlined and accessible room booking system and it is expected it will increase activation levels across all sites. This system is anticipated to go live once appropriate photos of the finished site and available rooms for hire are uploaded.

- 4.3.3 The Terms and Conditions of Hire are being finalised and will be promoted on the SpacetoCo and Council website. These terms and conditions will be consistent across Twelve25 Youth Centre, Para Hills Community Hub and Burton Community, but will differ slightly from those at the Salisbury Community Hub which operates under a different room hire model.
- 4.3.4 The Administration has already received numerous inquiries about hiring BCH with many groups requesting to delay any on-going bookings until the site is functional and they can visit the space.
- 4.3.5 The Administration also notes that it was difficult for groups to make firm bookings prior to the Fees and Charges being approved.
- 4.3.6 However, some external room bookings have already been taken and include:
  - 4.2.3.1 Helping Hand (two weekly respite bookings involving the workshop and art/craft activities);
  - 4.2.3.2 Incompro (two weekly social engagement programs including an Aboriginal men's cooking program and a workshop program building cultural tools); and
  - 4.2.3.2 Department of Human Services (staff training workshop).
- 4.4 <u>Partnerships</u>
  - 4.4.1 The Administration will continue to work with local stakeholders to build and strengthen partnership opportunities to create programs and services that provide a direct benefit to the local community.
  - 4.4.2 An example of a new partnership that the Administration is exploring is with Veterans SA to deliver a pilot program called "Co Work and Co Play". This program is anticipated to run for 8 weeks in October and will directly support veterans' wives and families from the local Edinburgh

# 5. CONCLUSION / PROPOSAL

- 5.1 The Burton Community Hub (BCH) will be an exciting new facility that will deliver community-driven services and programs for the Burton community and beyond through its Library, community programs, hire spaces, workshop and communal garden.
- 5.2 The BCH is due to be first opened on 25 July 2022 with the official opening event the following week on Sunday 31 July.
- 5.3 Activation of this site will commence from 1 August 2022 and up to \$30k has been allocated for program expenditure across the financial year for this site.
