PARK TERRACE LEVEL CROSSING TRAGEDY

The Mayor read the following statement:

The City of Salisbury acknowledges the 20-year anniversary of the level train crossing tragedy that occurred at 3:33pm on 24 October, 2002 - at the Park Terrace Level Crossing, Salisbury.

Four lives were lost as a result of the accident, which saw The Ghan passenger train collide with a passenger bus and other passenger vehicles at the intersection.

The tragic accident shocked residents and left a profound effect on the Salisbury community.

Following the crash, the Salisbury Train Crash Disaster Appeal Committee was established to support the families impacted by the accident. Generous residents donated around \$30,000 to the appeal, with the funds used to provide immediate support to impacted families.

To commemorate the 20th anniversary of the tragic accident, the City of Salisbury observed one minute's silence being 24 October at 3:33pm.

The City of Salisbury continues to remember all the families, staff and community members impacted by this tragedy on this significant anniversary. Please join with us as we observe a minute silence.

QON1 Question on Notice: Delays in FOGO Bin Pickups

Cr Adam Duncan had submitted the following questions:

- 1. What was the cause and what are the future impacts from the delays in FOGO bin pickups recently?
- 2. How many missed bin pickup complaints have been received by either NAWMA or Council from the properties located between The Grove Way and Cobbler Creek, Salisbury Heights.

General Manager City Infrastructure, Mr John Devine provided the following response:

We have received the following advice from NAWMA in relation to Cr Duncan's questions:

1. What was the cause and what are the future impacts from the delays in FOGO bin pickups recently?

Green-lid (FOGO) bin collections have been delayed because prolonged periods of high rainfall combined with recent warmer temperatures, have resulted in unusually high plant growth in suburban gardens. As a result, the volume of garden organic material requiring disposal via the kerbside bins has also increased. This is something that has been noticed across all of metropolitan Adelaide in recent weeks. Currently, NAWMA is collecting approximately 300 tonnes/week more FOGO material than usual for this time of year.

When kerbside FOGO bins are fuller, the collection trucks fill up more quickly. This means that the truck will service fewer houses than usual before it needs to return to the green waste yard to unload. The NAWMA region stretches from Valley View in the south to Willaston in the north and NAWMA's green waste facility is located in Edinburgh North. Increasing the number of trips to and from the green waste yard can potentially add hours to each collection day and when this happens, drivers are not able to service all of the houses in their regular collection areas within the usual time frame.

In addition to this, the continuous rainfall has kept garden material wet, making many bins heavier than the 80kg lifting capacity of the collection trucks. Initially, these bins had to be left on the kerb and residents notified to remove some of the contents, after which a truck could do a special return trip to empty the contents. As this problem increased in frequency, the collections contractor made a special temporary modification to the trucks to enable them to lift bins up to 120 kg. Note, this mechanism will be turned off when rainfall returns to more normal patterns so as not to impact the mechanical workings of the truck.

To better prepare for any similar future weather events, NAWMA is currently in talks with its collection's contractor about the option and availability of purchasing additional collection vehicles.

2. How many missed bin pickup complaints have been received by either NAWMA or Council from the properties located between The Grove Way and Cobbler Creek, Salisbury Heights.

There have been four (4) FOGO missed bin tickets logged in this area during the period of 1 September 2022 to 17 October 2022.

NAWMA has taken a proactive approach in alerting residents to any potential FOGO service interruptions, utilising a variety of channels to notify residents and ask that their bin is left on the kerb for 48 hours before contacting the NAWMA Customer Service Team, if it has not been emptied on the scheduled collection day/date. The channels displaying the FOGO service interruption are:
