

For your @home tasks:

Sort some things out of your Discovery Box

- Sort items that are made from natural materials: ie: paper, wood etc. Then sort items that are made from plastic. What other ways can you sort or classify the items in your Discovery Box?



Sort your bookshelf

- At the library we sort our collection of books. This makes it easier for us to find them. Do you have a collection of books @home? Can you sort them? You might like to do it by colour, size, or cover (hardcover or paperback)



Sorting Socks

- You already sort things at home. Think of the place you keep your socks. Go and get your socks from their spot and put them down in front of you. Are they all folded up in their pairs like these ones? Have you got a favourite pair? Find them. How long did that take? If you didn't keep your socks in pairs, do you think they would stay together? Undo the pairs. Do you think they would stay next to their mate or get all mixed up? Mix them up. Can you find your favourite pair?



Let's sort some toys

- Find some toys that you may have a collection of at home such as matchbox cars, coloured blocks or teddies. Collect a variety of toys and put them in front of you in a pile. You can leave these all in one pile and call it "My toys" or you can look for things that are similar and things that are different about the toys and make piles of things that go together. How did you sort your toys?
